The undersigned has the honour to report:

✓
THAT pursuant to Order in Council No. 1080 approved on the 7th day of August, 1942, Medicine Bowls Park was established as a Class "C" Provincial Park, in accordance with the provisions of Section 128 of the Forest Act, - Section 9, Chapter 13, Statutes of 1940:

THAT the Corporation of the City of Courtenay have made representations in respect to the acquisition of the land comprising this park; as the same is situated on the water supply serving the said City.

AND TO RECOMMEND:

THAT under the provisions of Section 127 of the Forest Act the said Medicine Bowls Provincial Park Class "C" be cancelled; and that the land comprising the same be sold to the Corporation of the City of Courtenay for the consideration of One (\$1.00) Dollar, plus Crown grant fee of Ten (\$10.00) Dollars, described as follows:-

"That part of the S.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 18, Township 9, Comox District, Plan 552 - G 1, which is shown outlined in red on plan deposited under 22916N, and containing 30.3 acres, more or less."
