The Lieutenant-Governor in Council:

The undersigned has the honour to report:

That a notice, dated I2th October I89I, was published in the British Columbia Gazette as follows:-

"Notice is hereby given that all the vacant Crown land which is
"situated on the Tsimpsean Peninsula, and which lies to the north
"of a line drawn due west from the head of Work Channel, is reserved
"from sale or pre-emption until further notice."

That at the date of that notice the maps in the Lands and Works

Department indicated that the Tsimpsean Peninsula covered certain land

which is now known as Kai-en Island.

That a contention has arisen that from the wording of the said notice Kai-en Island was not included and embraced by the reservation.

That without admitting in any way the correctness of such a contention it is advisable in the public interest that the matter should be set at rest.

The undersigned therefore recommends that Kaisan Island be reserved for Government purposes until further notice.
