The undersigned has the honour to report:

THAT the following described lands at Buck Lake are vacant Crown lands and are available for park purposes:

"Commencing at a point on the edge-of-the-bed of Buck Lake on the northerly shore thereof, said point being 10 chains west and 14 chains south of the northeast corner of D.L. 8752, Cariboo District; thence north 14 chains; thence east 20 chains; thence south 30 chains; thence west 10 chains; thence south 10 chains; thence west 19 chains to the edge-of-the-bed of Buck Lake; thence following the said edge-of-the-bed in a northerly direction to the point of commencement and containing 70 acres more or less."

THAT the Reid Lake Recreation Commission has expressed great interest that the above described lands be established as a Provincial Park at Buck Lake.

THAT an examination of the above described lands has found them to have a high recreational value and to be suitable and needed for park purposes.

AND TO RECOMMEND THAT in accordance with the provisions of the Department of Recreation and Conservation Act, the above described lands be constituted a Provincial Park of Class "C" to be known as Buck Lake Park.
