The Lieutenant-Governor in Council:

The undersigned has the honour to report:

Res. 716/88

AMN. 1243/76

THAT the following described lands have been examined and found to be suitable and needed for park purposes:

Commencing at the most easterly northeast corner of Lot 2144, Peace River District; thence south-easterly along the southerly boundary of the Alaska Highway right-of-way to the highwatermark of the Racing River, on the left bank thereof; thence southerly and westerly along the said high-watermark of the Racing River to the most northerly point of intersection of said highwatermark and the easterly boundary of Lot 2143 Peace River District, said point being more precisely designated by Monument 364, No. 4 on the Plan of Lot 2143; thence in a general northerly direction along the easterly boundary of Lot 2143 to the most northerly northeast corner of said Lot 2143; thence easterly along the southerly boundary of Lot 2144 to the southeast corner thereof; thence northerly along the easterly boundary of Lot 2144 to the northeast corner thereof, being the point of commencement and containing 176 acres, more or less;

AND TO RECOMMEND THAT under authority of the Park Act, the above described lands be constituted a Provincial Park of Class "A", Category 3, to be known as Racing River Wayside Park.
