The undersigned has the honour to report:

RES. 1116/77

THAT the following described lands have been donated to the Crown for park purposes:

That part of Parcel "G" (D.D.50624-I) of Section Seventy-Nine (79), Esquimalt District, bounded on the North by the Northerly boundary of said Parcel "G"; on the East by Plan 6416; on the South by Plan 10124 and on the West by Plan 11145, containing 4.6 acres more or less;

and

Lot Five (5), Section Ninety-Nine (99), Esquimalt District, Plan 4439, containing 2.21 acres more or less.

AND THAT the above described lands have been examined and found to be suitable and needed for park purposes.

AND TO RECOMMEND THAT under the authority of the Department of Recreation and Conservation Act, all of the above described lands be constituted a Provincial Park of Class 'C' to be known as Langford Centennial Park.
