The undersigned has the honour to recommend:

THAT under authority of Section 96 of the "Land Act" being Chapter 175, Revised Statutes of British Columbia, 1948, the reserve covering the following described area, established pursuant to Order-in-Council No. 11450, approved June 18th, 1952, be cancelled:

The east half of Lot 4497, Range 5, Coast Land District, except the north 60 chains thereof, comprising 26 acres, more or less, fronting on Francois Lake and situated approximately two miles west of Colleymount, B.C.

AND THAT under the provisions of Section 128 of the "Forest Act" being Chapter 128, Revised Statutes of British Columbia, 1948 and Amendments, the above-described lands be constituted a Provincial Park, for the pleasure and recreation of the public, to be known as "Colleymount Community Park".

AND THAT under the provisions of Section 129 of the "Forest Act" being Chapter 128, Revised Statutes of British Columbia, 1948 and Amendments, the said park be classified as a Provincial Park of Class "C".

AND FURTHER TO RECOMMEND THAT a certified copy of this minute, if approved, be forwarded to the Superintendent of Lands, Parliament Buildings, Victoria, B.C.
